

Darrell enjoyed every event at the fair, especially horse pulling, also listening to Walter sing and play his guitar on stage.



## **2023 Book Dedication**

#### Curtis C. Jewett

Curtis' relationship with Pittston Fair dates to the early 1950's when he showed and exhibited Ayrshire dairy cattle as a young 4-H member. Through the years he continued to serve the fair as a volunteer and helped support the fair's growth through his business, Jewett Builders.

Curtis and his crew completed three major structural renovations to the fair's historical museum building, including jacking, leveling the building, and replacing sills. In 1994 he and his crew moved Pittston's two-story Community Hall to the ground's, affording the fair association rental income, fund raising space for the community, and indoor vendor space during the fair. In 1995 two small camps were moved in by Curtis and crew, creating an office space and a Strawberry Pageant building. Today these camps are used to house the Pittston's Historical Society annual fair display, and storage. In 1996 Jewett Builders and Steve McGee Construction joined forces to build the pulling ring that continues to provide a full schedule of teamster pulling activities for fairgoer of all age's entertainment. Curtis would later, in 2021, jack, level, and replace sills under the pulling ring office.

For years Curtis and friends collected items that tell a story of the past to display in the Historical Museum. Since 2018 you would find him and his wife Nancy greeting fair goers as they mull over these historical gems. Just before opening day Curtis could be spotted driving his old 1954 Leland tractor to the fair to be on display outside the museum. Don't forget to tip your hat to the farmer on the tractor as you drive on by.



Wednesday, July 12 from 9:00 AM- 1:00 PM
No exhibits will be accepted after 1:00 PM on Wednesday.

Premiums: 1st - \$6 2nd - \$5 3rd - \$4

Premiums for Best of Hall \$35 (award given to best exhibit in the Hall)
Best of Show \$25 (award given for best exhibit in each department)
Honorable Mention \$15 (awards given in each department)

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

- 1. Exhibitors are limited to a total of 25 entries. No limit on the number of items an exhibitor may enter in each class, except for a limit of 10 photographs and 10 paintings per exhibitor.
- 2. Items previously exhibited at Pittston Fair will NOT be accepted.
- 3. Superintendent may refuse any article deemed unacceptable for exhibition.
- 4. All articles must be made by the person under whose name they are exhibited.
- 5. Care will be taken to prevent loss or damage, but in no case will the Pittston Fair Association be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- Judging will take place on Wednesday and Thursday, July 12-13. All judges' decisions are final.
- All exhibits will remain on display until 3:00 PM Sunday, July 16. Exhibitors must pick-up entries from 3:00 5:00 PM. Premiums will be paid at this time.
- 8. All paintings must be framed and ready to hang. Please use eyelets on the frame and wire for hanging. NO tape, string or yarn will be accepted for hanging.
- 9. Photographs must be framed and either ready to hang or be free-standing.
